

## Your Initial Visit

When should I arrive?	Please arrive at least fifteen (15) minutes early
What should I bring with me?	Photo Identification Insurance cards(s) Insurance referral from your Primary Doctor (if required by insurance) Completed new patient paperwork that was mailed to your home List of questions for the physician Paper/notebook and pen Copies of any recent abdominal/pelvic CT or PET scans, MRI, or ultrasounds on CD (if you do not have these, you must contact the facility where your test was performed and request a copy)
Can I bring someone with me?	Currently we are allowing one (1) person over the age of 18 to accompany our new patients to their visit. Please check with the office ahead of your visit to verify any changes to policy.
Are children allowed in the office?	For safety reasons, we do not allow children in the office.
What happens when I arrive?	The receptionist will collect your paperwork, insurance cards, and photo identification.  You will be asked to electronically sign documents in your medical chart. These documents include consent to bill your insurance carrier and provide them with medical records, consent for our practice to view your prescription benefits and medication history, and a review of your privacy contact information.
Will I have an exam?	Yes, most patients will have an internal exam
How long will my appointment last?	Every patient and diagnosis is different, but new patient appointment typically last 1-2 hours.
